A note from Pastor Chris

Thank you, Our Saviour Lutheran Church. And thanks be to God our Father through Jesus Christ our Lord that by the power of the Holy Spirit, your prayers and voices have called me to be your pastor!

My family and I were blessed by that weekend in October when we got to meet some of you in-person. We ate together. We laughed together. We listened. And we prayed together. My family and I sensed the Spirit's presence through your tremendous hospitality.

We are moving to Johnson City from Shiner, a small town in south Texas with a population of barely 2,000. Our daughter, Kayla, will be a freshman at Science Hill and our son, Joseph, will be a 5th grader at Lake Ridge Elementary. Their new schools will be a big change from Shiner ISD where PreK – 12th Grade are located all on a single campus, and the entire Freshman class has a total of 50 students! Yet Kayla and Joseph are excited to be part of the Johnson City school system and to make new friends and have new experiences.

My wife, Gemayel, is a pharmacist. She worked for 16 years as a staff pharmacist in a hospital setting where she routinely dispensed everything from pediatric medications to oncology medications. She even had the opportunity to be a preceptor who trained pharmacy students on internship. Gemayel is in the process of getting her license transferred to the State of Tennessee and will be looking for a job once we get settled into our new home.

I come from a long line of Texas Lutherans—both my parents and grandparents share this faith. On Palm Sunday of 1996, Gemayel and I were confirmed together at Martin Luther Lutheran Church (ELCA), a small congregation outside Victoria, Texas. We returned to the same church to be married in December 2005. After earning my Master of Divinity from the Lutheran Seminary Program in the Southwest (located in Austin), I was ordained in June of 2008. Our Saviour Lutheran Church in Johnson City will be the third congregation I have had the privilege to serve.

Serving the crucified and risen Lord Jesus Christ is a calling. It's the reason my family would pack up our belongings and move 1100 miles to Tennessee. It's the same reason we load up our families in the car and drive across town on Sunday mornings to church. It's the reason we bring our children to Sunday School and the reason we give our faithful offerings, all because Christ calls us to be disciples.

My first Sunday as your pastor will be January 4, the day the church celebrates the Epiphany of Our Lord. Just as Christ was revealed to the world as the Word made flesh, I look forward to seeing how Christ will be revealed in my ministry through Our Saviour Lutheran Church. I look forward to seeing how we can be disciples, together, as the church.




News From the Kitchen

With the 9:00 am social hour on Sundays, many more people are using the kitchen. So, it is time for some reminders.

Because we have the Melting Pot program, Health Department personnel come periodically to inspect our kitchen. They can shut down the program if we are found to be out of compliance. The rules for the kitchen are as follows:

- Large quantities of unlabeled food in the refrigerator or freezer are for the Melting Pot program. Foods put in the refrigerator or freezer by other groups or individuals **must be labeled** with names of responsible parties and the date. They will be disposed of at the 'use by' date.
- **Unlabeled food not for Melting Pot will be thrown away.**
- In the storage area behind the kitchen, three shelves are assigned to the Melting Pot program. Please do not take items from those shelves or store other items there.
- Try to put things where they belong on the labeled shelves so everyone can find what they are looking for.

Thank you from your kitchen volunteers for helping us to keep our kitchen clean, organized and in compliance.




