
# **Food Pantry**

Any items donated for the food pantry are always welcome, but for the month of December we ask that you consider our Annual Reverse Advent Project.

In the past, OSLC has had many participate in our annual Reverse Advent Project. This is a way for families to share the true meaning of Christmas while stocking the OSLC food pantry. It works this way: during advent (beginning Sunday, November 30th), you can pick up a box that contains a list of needed canned goods and non-perishable items. You also receive a set of stickers to be placed on the 'food' list once that item has been placed in the box. Over the next four weeks, families can work together letting children know they are helping someone that might otherwise be hungry. If you feel the purchases might be cost prohibitive, use the buddy system and pair up with another family. The boxes full of food will be returned and blessed on December 28.

#### A few hints:

- · Shop with a family of four in mind. Please do not provide large or extra large sizes. Sometimes the person needing food rides the bus to pick up food and they must be able to manage/lift and carry it home.
- · NO glass containers. Please purchase only plastic, paper or tin. Again, sometimes getting the food home can be troublesome and things can get broken.
- · If possible, try to get tin cans with zip-lock lids. Often times the elderly do not have enough strength in their hands to use a can opener, or, when living in alternative housing, may not have a can opener.
- · Store brands are cheaper.
- · Don't let the cost or the chore of shopping keep you from participating. Use the buddy system or just supply the amount you are comfortable with.
- · Shelf-stable milk and jelly are cheaper at the Dollar Tree.





#### **News From the Kitchen**

With the 9:00 am social hour on Sundays, many more people are using the kitchen. So, it is time for some reminders.

Because we have the Melting Pot program, Health Department personnel come periodically to inspect our kitchen. They can shut down the program if we are found to be out of compliance. The rules for the kitchen are as follows:

- Large quantities of unlabeled food in the refrigerator or freezer are for the Melting Pot program. Foods put in the refrigerator or freezer by other groups or individuals <u>must be labeled</u> with names of responsible parties and the date. They will be disposed of at the 'use by' date.
- Unlabeled food not for Melting Pot will be thrown away.
- In the storage area behind the kitchen, three shelves are assigned to the Melting Pot program. Please <u>do not</u> take items from those shelves or store other items there.
- Try to put things where they belong on the labeled shelves so everyone can find what they are looking for.

Thank you from your kitchen volunteers for helping us to keep our kitchen clean, organized and in compliance.

# **Instructions**
